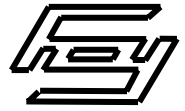

Financial Notes:

1. Bank interest will be apportioned pro-rata between General Fund, Flagg Chapel Fund and BUYAN Funds at financial year end (31st March 2009).
2. The Society's finances remain in a healthy state.
3. The financial picture is a little better than this time last year because of extra income from IRF 'Oldies', higher bank interest and printing of Stockton Unitarians monthly calendar, and lower expenditure because the Spring edition of *Foy News* fell into the previous financial year.
4. It should be noted that most of our income comes in early in the financial year whereas the bulk of expenditure (affiliation fees, GA Meetings costs, *Foy News*, etc) come later so the General Fund surplus will fall as the year progresses.
