Prospecting for Ministry - Report of the December Forum from Kate Taylor

There were only three of us at the Forum on 3rd December and we were all very much in accord. But we cannot take our views as reflecting those of the wider congregation. We talked first about the notion of a Yorkshire Unitarian Union Collaborative Ministry for which ministers would be appointed by Bradford/Wakefield, Hull/York, and Leeds. We would look for some financial support from the YUU, employing some of the money from the sale of Pudsey Chapel. We would also hope that some money could be released from the (long ago) sale of the chapel at Halifax, Northgate End. Westgate Chapel itself has already applied for money from the 20:20 Congregational Development Scheme. A collaborative team would include the YUU lay preachers and might, we hoped, draw on the experience and wisdom of the Reverend Bill Darlison. Whilst we would expect regular reports to YUU meetings, each chapel, or pair of chapels, would have ultimate responsibility for paying its minister. We thought this Collaborative Ministry was a good idea and saw money as the major obstacle.

But what would be want of the ministers? They could be male or female. They should be good communicators, speaking intelligibly! We were happy to have people fresh from college, hoping that they would bring enthusiasm, and be up-to-date. They must be able to relate especially well to young people. They must be resourceful, ready to make initiatives, and have the pastoral skills to care for the older members of the congregations. We thought, too, that they should be committed to the activities both of the YUU and the General Assembly and should really be 'part of the Movement'.

Unitarians on Radio 4

A lively discussion has followed the inclusion of two Unitarian 'Thoughts for the Day' on Radio 4's Boxing Day 'Today' programme. The guest editor was Tim Berners-Lee, Unitarian and inventor of the worldwide web. An atheist Unitarian minister (Andy Pakula) gave an 'alternative' Thought for the Day and a theist Unitarian minister (Jim Corrigall) gave the traditional Thought for the Day. The controversy? The BBC would not accept an atheist Thought for the Day in the traditional time slot, despite previously accepting Buddhist (non-theist) speakers. Some media coverage can be found in various newspapers online. A secondary discussion has ensued on the Facebook discussions - to what extent will this very high profile coverage change the fortunes of declining Unitarianism? Does the energy we put into advertising ourselves divert attention from our work to be effective, supportive and engaged communities? Will people wish to join us because they agree with us, or because they find a community of which they wish to be a part?
