

She put such effort into the Chantry Chapel, which touchingly has had its flag at half mast. WAKEFIELD INTERFAITH GROUP

At the A.G.M. on April 21st Brian Hamill was elected as Chairperson for the coming year, Secretary is Cynthia Dickinson, Treasurer Michelle Langham and I.T. Secretary Helen Holmes. The Steering Group members are Geoff Fielding, Sheila Hammond, Maureen Jones and Bishop Tony Robinson. Linda Fielding of the Quakers and Amnesty International told us about Wakefield being a City of Sanctuary. When we see newcomers about we cannot be sure whether they are Asylum Seekers, Refugees or Migrant Workers. Asylum Seekers are people who fled from their homeland because they were frightened of being persecuted. They are legally allowed to apply for asylum. At present we have about 350 such people in Wakefield. Refugees are those whose application has been successful. They can stay and have the same rights as anyone else. There are about 200 children in our schools who are asylum

seekers or refugees. They need friendship, legal advice, clothes and language lessons. Also there are people who have been refused asylum and they are in great difficulties re housing, money and food and must report to the Home Office centre in Leeds every week when they may not even have the bus fare to do it. if you can help please see the information in Chapel
